The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This day the Right Hon. Henry Richard Lord Holland was, by his Majesty's command, sworn of his Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

DOWNING-STREET, August 20.

The King has been pleased to appoint the Right Hon. Henry Richard Lord Holland, and the Right Hon. William Lord Auckland, to be Joint Commissioners and Plenipotentiaries for arranging and finally settling the several matters in discussion between his Majesty's Government and the Government of the United States, with James Monroe and William Pinckney, Esquires, the Commissioners appointed for similar purposes on the part of the said United States.

The King has also been pleased to appoint the Hon. William Frederick Elliott Eden to be Secretary, and John Allen, Esq. to be Assistant-Secretary to the aforesaid commission.

WHITEHALL, Aug. 15.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Richard Legh (heretofore Richard Crosse), of Adlington-hall, in the county palatine of Chester, Esq. (only son and heir of Thomas Crosse, late of Shaw-hill, in the county palatine of Lancaster, Esq. deceased, and grandson of Richard Crosse, of Crosse-hall, in the said county of Lancaster, Esq. by Ann, his wife, eldest daughter and co-heir of Robert Legh of Chorley, in the said county of Lancaster, Esq. which Robert was the second son of Thomas Legh, late of Adlington-hall aforesaid, Esq. also deceased), his royal licence and authority that he and his issue may take and use the surname and bear the arms of Legh only, in compliance with an injunction contained in the

last will and testament of Charles Legh, late of Adlington-hall aforesaid, Esq. deceased, son and heir of John Legh, of the same place, and grandson of the said Thomas Legh, bearing date the 28th of January 1778; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office.

And also to order, that this his Majesty's concession and declaration be registered in his College of Arms:
