ELECTORAL DIVISIONS.

ORDER BY THE SECRETARY FOR SCOTLAND UNDER THE EDUCATION (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1918.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 2 of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1918, and after compliance with the procedure therein prescribed, I, the Right Honourable Robert Munro, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, hereby direct that the electoral divisions of the education area of the County of Fife, the number of members to be elected to the Education Authority of the said area, and the apportionment of such members among the electoral divisions shall be as follows:—
