* * * In the hurry of publishing the Extraordinary Gazette on Friday the 5th instant, the following passage in Sir John Stuart's dispatch was omitted to be inserted between the paragraph ending with the words "during my movement," and the paragraph beginning "After some loose firing,"

"Had General Regnier thought proper to remain upon his ground, the difficulties of access to him were such, that I could not possibly have made an impression upon him. But quitting this advantage, and crossing the river with his entire force, he came down to meet us upon the open plain—a measure to which he was no doubt encouraged by a consideration of his cavalry, an arm with which, unfortunately, I was altogether unprovided."
