SECTION V.—Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I., II., III., and IV. of this Part of this Schedule a Female Worker entering the Trade for the first time at or over the age of 16 years and a Male Worker entering the Trade for the first time at or over the age of 18 years, may be employed for a period not exceeding six months at a General Minimum Time-Rate which is less by  $\frac{1}{2}d$ . per hour in the case of Female Workers and less by 1d. per hour in the case of Male Workers than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable under Sections I., II., III., and IV. of this Part of this Schedule.

SECTION VI.—In cases where a worker is em- | Trade.

ployed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker an amount not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable as set out in Sections I., II., III., and IV. of this Part of this Schedule. Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-Rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall only be had, in the case of female workers, to the earnings of workers of 18 years of age and over, and in the case of male workers, to the earnings of workers of 21 years of age and over, who, in both cases, have had not less than six months' experience in the Trade.
