The following Areas are now "Movement  
Areas" for purposes of Part I. of the Sheep  
(Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

*Caithness.*—An area comprising:—  
*The County of Caithness; and*  
*In the County of Sutherland:*  
The Parishes of Farr and Kildonau.

*Inverness.*—(1) An Area comprising the islands  
known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the*  
*islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, and*  
*Boreray*), in the County of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the County of Inverness,  
comprising the islands known as Skye or  
Inner Hebrides.

*Ross and Cromarty.*—An Area comprising the  
Islands of Lewis, including the smaller  
islands adjacent thereto, in the County of  
Ross and Cromarty.

*Sutherland.*—See under *Caithness.*
