The Guaranteed Time-Rates for piece-workers are for the purpose of securing to workers employed on piece-work, a minimum rate of remuneration on a time-work basis, and any such worker is entitled to be paid at not less than the Guaranteed Time-Rate applicable to a worker of her age and experience as set out in this Section, in any case where her earnings on piece-work are less than such sum.

- (ii) The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Female Worker employed on time work in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work shall be as follows:
 - (a) For all hours worked in excess of 5 on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter, for the first two hours, and One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half thereafter, notwith-standing that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(b) For all time worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double-Time, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

- (c) For all hours worked in excess of 48 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-Quarter for the first two hours and Time-and-a-Half thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-Sections (a) and (b) of this Section.
- (d) The Overtime Rates shall not apply to Piece-Workers.
