

APPLICATION OF PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES.

In the case of Male Workers of 21 years of age or over employed on piece-work, each piece-work paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, at least the equivalent of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, to an ORDINARY WORKER, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE WORKERS OF 21 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER AND FOR ALL FEMALE WORKERS.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III. of the Schedule of the Notice D.B. (5), issued by the Trade Board, and dated 27th July 1922, shall apply in substitution for the rates set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours which, as set out in Part III. of the Schedule, dated 27th July 1922, the Trade Board have declared to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART IV.

The above proposed respective Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Board Acts, to all Male Workers of 21 years of age or over, and to all Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in the General Waste branch of the Waste Material Reclamation Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 27th August 1920, and set out in Part IV. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice D.B. (5), dated 27th July 1922.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL TO VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 3rd day of November 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, General Waste Materials Reclamation Trade Board (Great Britain), 1 Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

COTTON WASTE RECLAMATION
TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).
MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND
FEMALE WORKERS.

This Notice sets out the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers as varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by an Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 21st October 1922, together with the Minimum Rates which are not affected by the variation and which remain in operation.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:—

- (1) The General Minimum Time Rates marked † and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 1st November 1922.*
- (2) The General Minimum Time Rates marked ‡ and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 17th July 1922.
- (3) All the other Minimum Rates as from 1st April 1922.

* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond

with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by any employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 7th November 1922.

General Minimum Time-Rates.

Male Workers of 21 years of age and over, 1s. 0d. per hour.

Male Workers under 21 years of age (according to age). *See* Section I. of Part I. of the Schedule below.

Female Workers of 18 years of age and over—
In England and Wales, 7d. per hour; in Scotland, 6½d. per hour.

Female Workers under 18 years of age (according to age). *See* Section II. of Part I. of the Schedule below.

Overtime Rates. — (*See* Part II. of the Schedule below).

The Rates in full as legally enforceable are set out in detail in the Schedule below.
