Whereas our Parliament stands prorogued to Wednesday the Twenty ninth Day of this instant october, We, with the advice of our Privy Conncil, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said Twenty-ninth Day of this instant October, to Thursday the Twenty-seventh Day of November next; and We have given order to our Chancellor of that part of our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: And We do surther hereby, with the advice aforesaid, declare our Royal Will an I Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Twenty-seventh Day of November next, be held and sit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burgess, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly at Westminster, on the said Twenty-seventh Day of November next.
