A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

Whereas our Parliament stands prorogued to Wednesday the Twenty-ninth Day of this instant October, We, with the advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said Twenty-ninth Day of this instant October, to Thursday the Twenty-seventh Day of November next; and We have given order to our Chancellor of that part of our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: And We do further hereby, with the advice aforesaid, declare our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Twenty-seventh Day of November next, be held and sit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burgs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly at Westminster, on the said Twenty-seventh Day of November next.

Given at our Court at the Queen's Palace, the Tenth Day of October, One Thousand eight hundred and six, in the Forty-sixth Year of our Reign.

The King has been graciously pleased to grant unto the Right Hon. William Earl Nelson, Doctor in Divinity, &c. Wm. Haslewood, Esq. and Dame Emma Hamilton, (widow of the late Right Hon. Sir William Hamilton, K. B. deceased,) on behalf of Horatio Nelson Thomson, (an Infant,) his Royal Licence and Authority, that she he said Horatio Nelson Thomson may assume and use the Surname of Nelson only, in compliance with an injunction contained in a codicil annexed to the last Will and Testament of the late Right Hon. Horatio Viscount and Baron Nelson of the Nile, and of Burnham Thorpe, in the county of Norfolk. Baron Nelson of the Nile, and of Hilborough, in the said county, Knight of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, Vice Admiral of the White Squadron, Duke of Bronte, in the kingdom of farther Sicily, &c. deceased.

And also to order that this his Majesty's said concession and declaration be registered in his College of Arms, otherwise to be void and of none effect.
