

platoons of his company he seized and held a hill in advance of the main position. He was under close enfilade fire from the enemy the whole time. His senior Indian Officer had been killed and fourteen other ranks wounded during the three hours he held the hill.

During the whole time, by his coolness and judgment, he set a splendid example to his men. Finally, when ordered to retire, still under very accurate fire, he removed the remainder of the wounded and all Lewis guns and arms.
