A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING THE PROCLAMATION OF 11TH OCTOBER 1923, FOR DISCONTINUING THE BRANCH MINT AT SYDNEY.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Coinage Act, 1870, We did, by the Sydney Mint (Discontinuance) Proclamation, 1923, direct that the establishment of the Branch of Our Royal Mint at or near Sydney in New South Wales should, as from the first day of January nineteen hundred and twenty-four, be discontinued :

And whereas it has now been represented to Us that it is expedient that the establishment of the said Branch Mint should be continued :

And whereas by virtue of the said Act it is lawful for Us, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation, to revoke any Proclamation previously made under the said Act :

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows :—

1. The Sydney Mint (Discontinuance) Proclamation, 1923, is hereby revoked, and the said Branch Mint shall continue to be established as if the said Proclamation had never been made.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the

Sydney Mint (Discontinuance) Proclamation (Revocation) Proclamation, 1923.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Nineteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and in the Fourteenth year of Our Reign.
