WHEREAS the Scottish Board of Health has, under the provisions of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, as amended by the Scottish Board of Health Act, 1919, made a Representation that they have received a copy of an Interlocutor of the Sheriff of Ayrshire dated the 21st December 1923, finding that the old burial ground of Wallacetown situated at the junction of King Street and Russell Street in the Burgh, Parish and County of Ayr, is dangerous to health, offensive and contrary to decency:

And whereas in the said Representation it was recommended that burials should be forthwith discontinued in the said old burial ground of Wallacetown in terms of the said first-named Act, with the exceptions hereinafter specified:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 16th April 1924, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 28th May 1924, and that the said Order, or Notice thereof, should be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and that copies of the said Order, or Notice thereof, should be fixed on some conspicuous places within the Parish or Parishes affected, one month before the said 28th May 1924:

And whereas Notice of the said Representation, and of the time when it pleased His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council has been duly published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and fixed in the manner required by the said Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows, viz. :—

That burials be forthwith discontinued in the old burial ground of Wallacetown in terms of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, except for the burial therein of the following persons on the conditions after specified:—

(1) Any person of the age of sixty years or upwards at the date of the Order in Council closing the said burial ground whose husband or wife shall have been interred therein previous to the date of the said Order in Council; (2) Any person of the age of sixty years or upwards at the date of the said Order in Council who shall thereafter die unmarried and whose father or mother shall have been interred in the said

burial ground previous to the date of the said Order in Council. Provided, however, as regards all future interments:—(a) That the exercise of the said right of burial shall not be injurious to Public Health; (b) That no grave shall be less than five feet deep, and that no grave be buried in unless it can be opened to that depth without the exposure of coffins; (c) That notice be given to the Sanitary Inspector of Ayr on the day preceding that on which a grave has to be opened; (d) That the permission to inter is revocable at any time.
