EDUCATION (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1918.

COUNTY OF ARGYLL.

ORDER by the Secretary for Scotland determining the electoral divisions of the education area of the County of Argyll, the number of members to be elected to the education authority, and the apportionment of these members among the electoral divisions of the education area.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section two of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1918, and after compliance with the procedure therein prescribed, I, the Right Honourable Sir John Gilmour, Bart., His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, hereby direct that the electoral divisions of the education area of the County of Argyll, the number of Members to be elected to the Education Authority of the said area, and the apportionment of such members among the electoral divisions shall be as follows:—
