COUNTY COUNCIL ELECTORAL  
DIVISIONS OF WEST LOTHIAN.

Whereas the contents and boundaries of the Electoral Divisions of Linlithgow East and Linlithgow West, in the County of West Lothian, were determined by an Order under the hands and common seal of the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland dated the 3rd July 1891;

And whereas the County Council of the County of West Lothian have represented to me that it is desirable to alter the contents and

boundaries of the Electoral Divisions of Linlithgow East and Linlithgow West;

And whereas I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the representation of the County Council;

Now therefore I, the undersigned, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, in virtue of the powers conferred on me by Section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, do hereby order as follows:—

The Linlithgow East and Linlithgow West Electoral Divisions as defined by the said Order of the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland, dated the 3rd July 1891, shall from and after this date have the following description and contents:—

Name of Division.	Contents of Division.
Linlithgow East.	That part of the Parish of Linlithgow which lies to the east of a line drawn in a northerly direction along the centre of the road leading North from West Binny over Mains Burn past Ochiltree Mill and Wester Ochiltree to a point at the intersection of that road with the Haugh Burn, thence in a straight line drawn in a northerly direction to a point at the junction of the Edinburgh and Linlithgow Road with the road leading to Philpstoun Station, thence along the road leading past Kingsfield to Groughfoot, from the point at which the first mentioned road enters the Parish to the point at which last mentioned road leaves it.
Linlithgow West.	The remainder of the Parish of Linlithgow exclusive of the portion included within the limits of the Burgh of Linlithgow.
