1894 to 1906.

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council the draft of an Order in Council under section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, to provide for the registration as British ships of vessels (not being Ships of War forming part of the Royal Navy) belonging to the Government of the Colony of the Falkland Islands.

And notice is hereby further given, that copies of the draft Order in Council can be obtained by any public body within forty days of the date of this notice at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 1st May 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £30,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 4th May 1925 to Saturday the 9th May 1925 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1000, and £5000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 31st March 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from

Monday the 4th May 1925 to Saturday the 9th May 1925 inclusive; the first Dividend payable on the 15th October 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 22ND APRIL 1925.)

IMPORTED ANIMALS ORDER OF 1925.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested

in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Facilities to be given to Inspectors.

1.—(1) The occupier of any premises, or in his absence any person in charge of the premises, to which imported animals have under a licence been brought for the purposes of detention shall, on demand by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, provide all reasonable assistance and facilities to enable the Inspector to examine the animals on such premises or such of them as the Inspector may desire to examine, in order that he may ascertain whether the animals are marked in accordance with the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2), or any Order of the Minister made thereunder, and the numbers of the tags on such animals as are tagged, and generally to satisfy himself that the provisions of the said Act or any Order made thereunder are being complied with.

(2) Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of this Order shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of May nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the IMPORTED ANIMALS ORDER OF 1925.

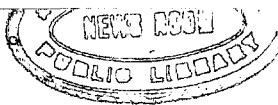
