WESTMINSTER, Jan. 22. 1807.

THIS day the Lords being met, and the Commons attending, the Royal Assent, by Commission, was given to an act for continuing and granting to His Majesty certain duties upon malt in Great Britain, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and seven.

An act for continuing and granting to His Majesty a duty on pensions, offices, and personal estates in England; and certain duties on sugar, malt, tobacco and snuff, in Great Britain, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and seven. And one private act.

Copy of a letter from John Barker, commanding His Majesty's armed brig Grenada, to Rear Admiral the Hon. Sir Alexander Cochrane, K. B.

*His Majesty's Brig Grenada, St. George's, Grenada, Nov. 27. 1806.*

SIR—I have the satisfaction to acquaint you, that at daylight this morning, London Bridge Rock bearing east three leagues, I discovered a suspicious vessel to the southward; and, after a chase of four hours, came up with and captured the French sloop privateer *Le Tigre*, mounting two six pounders, and twenty-six men, out from Guadaloupe fifteen days, and had taken a mail boat.

I have much satisfaction in this capture, as the vessel sails very fast, and has done considerable damage to the coasting trade of St. Lucia and St. Vincent's. I have the honour to be, &c.
