WIDOWS', ORPHANS', AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS, 1925.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, acting jointly with the Minister of Health and the Scottish Board of Health, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 23 (1) of the Widows', Orphans', and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act, 1925, to make Regulations in conjunction with the Treasury amending the Contributory Pensions (Residential Qualifications) Regulations, 1925.

Notice is hereby given that the Scottish Board of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, have made Regulations, dated 10th April 1926.

The Regulations may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Medical Benefit) Amendment Regulations (Scotland), 1926, and prescribe the amount which the Board may pay out of the Special Drug Fund to Panel Committees in respect of the clerical work involved in their investigation of excessive prescribing.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas in Scotland are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I. of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

Inverness.—(1) An Area comprising the Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the Island of Lewis, including the smaller island adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.
