DOWNING STREET, March 11. 1807 LORD VISCOUNT HOWICK, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for foreign affairs, has this day notified to the Ministers of friendly and neutral powers resident at this Court, that in consequence of the recent proceedings, and the present position of the enemy upon the continent, which enables him to command the navigation of the rivers Elbe, Weser, and Ems, His Majesty has judged it expedient to re-establish the most rigorous blockade at the entrances of those rivers, and to maintain and enforce the same, according to the usages of war acknowledged and allowed in similar cases.
