WESTMINSTER, March 17. 1807.
THIS day, the Lords being met, and the Commons attending, the Royal Assent, by commission, was given to an Act for raising the sum of fourteen millions two hundred thousand pounds, by way of annuities.

An Act for granting to His Majesty, until twelve months after the ratification of a definitive treaty of peace, certain additional duties of excise on brandy in Great Britain.

An Act to grant to His Majesty certain inland discontinuous descriptions.

An Act to grant to His Majesty certain inland divises of excise and taxes in Ireland, and to allow certain drawbacks in respect thereof, in lieu of former duties of excise taxes and drawbacks.

An Act to provide more effectually for regulating the drawbacks and bounties on the exportation of sugar from Ireland, and for allowing British plantation sugar to be warehoused in Ireland, until the 25th day of March 1808.

An Act for repealing so much of an Act, made in the ninth year of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, as vests in the South Sea Company or Corporation by the said Act erected, the sole and exclusive privilege of carrying on trade and traffic to and from any part whatspeever of South America, or in the South Seas, which
