ALTERATION OF PARISH AREAS.  
PROPOSED ORDER NO. LX.

PARISHES OF BOTHWELL AND OLD  
MONKLAND.

Whereas it has been represented to me by the County Council of the County of Lanark that I should issue an Order under Section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, and Section 46 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1894, annexing to the Parish of Old Monkland that portion of the Parish of Bothwell which lies within the Burgh of Coatbridge; and whereas, after consulting with the authorities concerned, I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the said representation;

Now therefore, I, the undersigned, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Local Government (Scotland) Acts, order as follows:—

1. The portion of the Parish of Bothwell situated within the Burgh of Coatbridge shall cease to form part of the Parish of Bothwell, and shall form part of the Parish of Old Monkland.

2. Nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of creditors or of persons having vested interests.

3. This Order shall take effect as from the fifteenth day of May 1927.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

**REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION OF BOYS AND GIRLS TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.**

*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. AGE.—The limits of age are 16 and 17. For an examination beginning in one of the first six months of the year the governing date on which candidates must be of the prescribed age is the first of March; for an examination beginning in one of the last six months of the year the governing date is the first of September. A candidate who attained the age of 16 on the governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained 17 on that date would not be admitted.

In reckoning age for competition persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. NATIONALITY. — Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects:

Provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

4. The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows:—

5. All candidates take subjects 1 and 2; they may also offer all or any of the optional subjects 3 to 7. In these optional subjects a high standard of performance will be required, so that really good work on optional subjects aggregating 600 will get more marks than moderate work on a greater number and a candidate can be successful on optional subjects aggregating 600 or 700 as well as on a greater number.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. The examination may be held in one part or in two parts, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In the latter case the first part of the examination will be used to reduce the number of competitors to be admitted to the second part. Of those whose performance on the first part is best a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks on the whole examination. If the examination is held in two parts, the second part may be held in fewer centres than the first.

7. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service. Subject to this condition, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

8. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the examination.

9. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of £2 will be required from every candidate attending an examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 29th November 1927. The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the first part of the examination may be held:—Aberdeen, Belfast, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Edinburgh,

Glasgow, Hull, Leeds, Liverpool, London, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Norwich, Nottingham, Plymouth, Portsmouth and Preston.

The final list of centres will be decided when the number of candidates desiring examination at each centre is known.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 4th October 1927, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now " Movement Areas " for the purposes of Part I. of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

*Inverness.*—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

*Ross and Cromarty.*—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

Such part of the county of Dunbarton as lies within the following boundary, viz:—

Commencing at the Pier at Tarbet on the West Shore of Loch Lomond and proceeding westwards along the road leading from said Pier past Tarbet Hotel to Arrochar Pier; thence southwards along the Eastern Shore of Loch Long and eastwards along the northern Shore of the Firth of Clyde to Rosneath Point; thence south eastwards in a straight line from Rosneath Point to Ardmore Point; thence north eastwards along the road leading from Ardmore Point *via* Lyleston Farm, Darleith Farm, and Stoneymollan to the point where the said road joins the highway from Luss to Dunbarton; thence along the private road leading from the said last mentioned point to the boathouse at Drumkinnon Bay in Loch Lomond and thence northwards along the western shore of Loch Lomond to the point of commencement.

An Area comprising:—

*In the county of Inverness.*

So much of the parishes of Duthil and Rothiemurchus, Moy and Dalarossie, and Abernethy and Kincardine as are comprised within the under-mentioned area:

*In the county of Nairn.*

So much of the parishes of Cawdor and Ardlach as are comprised within the under-mentioned area:

*In the county of Elgin.*

So much of the parishes of Edinkillie, Cromdale Inverallan and Advie, Dallas and Knockando as are comprised within the under-mentioned area:

*In the county of Banff.*

So much of the parishes of Inveraven and Kirkmichael as are comprised within the under-mentioned area, namely:—

Commencing at the point on the River Spey where it is crossed by the road from Grantown Station to Grantown, thence in a north easterly direction along the River Spey to Cromdale Bridge, thence in a north westerly direction along the old road *via* West Part, Garrow Mill, and Heathfield, thence in a north westerly direction to the L. M. & S. Rly. bridge at Lynmacgregor, thence in a southerly direction to its junction with the old road from Glenbeg to Inveradon, thence along the latter road to the River Spey, thence in a westerly direction along that river to its junction with the River Dul-

nan; thence in a generally westerly direction along the last mentioned river to the point where it is crossed by the Highland Railway from Inverness to Aviemore; thence along that railway in a generally north western direction to the point where it crosses the River Findhorn; thence in a northerly and north easterly direction along that river to its junction with the River Divie near Relugas House; thence in an easterly and then southerly direction along the last named river to the point where it meets the road from Stripeside to Dallas; thence in a north easterly direction along that road *via* Johnstripe, Lochna Graan, Redcraig, Auchness and Craigroy to the point where it is joined by the road leading to Priestfield and Kirdellbeg; thence in a southerly direction along the latter road to its junction with the road leading to Blacksboat Station; thence

easterly along the last mentioned road to the county boundary; thence in a southerly, westerly and southerly direction along the county boundary to the point where it meets the road leading from Advie to Bridge of Avon; thence easterly along that road to its junction with the River Avon; thence in a southerly direction along the River Avon *via* Drumin, Balnellan, and Strathavon Lodge to the Bridge of Avon north west of Tomintoul; thence along the road leading from Bridge of Avon to Bridge of Brown; thence in a westerly and then northerly direction along General Wade's Military Road *via* Lynemore, Ballenluig and Topperfettle and the road leading to Grantown Station to the point of commencement.
