POST OFFICE REGISTER REGULATIONS, 1925—AMENDMENT OF REGULATION 13.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have in conjunction with the Postmaster General made the following Provisional Regulations dated the 15th July 1927, under the Act 5 & 6 Geo. V., c. 93 amending Regulation 13 of the Post Office Register Regulations, 1925, dated August 7, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925 No. 788):—

(1) The following shall be substituted for paragraph (1) of Regulation 13 of the Post Office Register Regulations, 1925:—

“(1) Subject to the terms of the prospectus relating to the issue of any stock on the register and subject, as hereinafter provided, the holder of any stock or securities on the books of the Bank of England or of the Bank of Ireland may, if the stock or securities is or are of a description corresponding to any stock of that issue, exchange that stock or those securities for stock on the register of a corresponding amount and description:

“Provided that no person shall be entitled to exchange at any one time stock or securities of a nominal amount exceeding one thousand pounds, unless the stock or securities is or are the property of a friendly society entitled under section thirty-nine of the Income Tax Act, 1918, to exemption from income tax.”

(2) These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office Register Regulations, 1927.

MERCHANDISE MARKS.

THE MERCHANDISE MARKS EXEMPTION DIRECTION (No. 3), 1927, DATED AUGUST 3, 1927, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 1 (3) OF THE MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 GEO. 5, c. 53).

Whereas the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5, c. 53), Section 1, provides that it shall not be lawful to sell, expose for sale, or, by way of advertising goods of some other kind, distribute, in the United Kingdom, any imported goods to which there is applied any name or trade mark being, or purporting to be, the name or trade mark of any manufacturer, dealer or trader or the name of any place or district in the United Kingdom, unless the name or trade mark is accompanied by an indication of origin;

And whereas Subsection (3) of the said Section 1 provides that if the Board of Trade are satisfied after considering such representations (if any) as may be made to them by any persons appearing to the Board of Trade to have a substantial interest in the matter, that, having regard to the special circumstances of the trade, difficulties would arise if the said Section 1 applied to goods of any class or description, or goods sold under any particular designation, and that public interests in the United Kingdom would not be materially prejudiced by exempting such goods from the operation of the said Section 1, they may direct that the said Section 1 shall not apply to such goods, or that goods shall not be treated as falling under the said Section 1 by reason only that they are so designated;

Now therefore the Board of Trade, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter and, after consultation with the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, being satisfied that, having regard to the special circumstances of the trade, difficulties would arise if the said Section 1 applied to Farm and Garden Seeds, and that public interests in the United Kingdom would not be materially prejudiced by exempting Farm and Garden Seeds from the operation of the said Section 1, hereby direct in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Subsection (3) as follows:—

1. Section 1 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, shall not apply to Farm and Garden Seeds.
2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks Exemption Direction (No. 3), 1927.

THE VENEREAL DISEASES FIFE AND KINROSS COMBINATION AMENDMENT ORDER, 1927, DATED 4TH AUGUST 1927, MADE BY THE SCOTTISH BOARD OF HEALTH.

Whereas by the Venereal Diseases Fife and Kinross Combination Order, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), made by the Scottish Board of Health under Section 83 of the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1897, it is provided that the following Authorities (hereinafter referred to as "the Combining Authorities"), being local authorities within the meaning of the said Act of 1897, shall act together for the purposes of carrying out the Regulations made under Section 78 of the said Act of 1897 by the Local Government Board for Scotland in their Order dated 26th October 1916, with a view to the diagnosis, treatment and prevention of Venereal Diseases, or any further Regulations made with reference thereto, that is to say:—

- (1) The Cupar District Committee in the County of Fife;
- (2) The Dunfermline District Committee in the said County;
- (3) The Kirkcaldy District Committee in the said County;
- (4) The St. Andrews District Committee in the said County;
- (5) The County Council of the County of Kinross;
- (6) The Town Council of the Burgh of Auchtermuchty;
- (7) The Town Council of the Burgh of Cupar;

- (8) The Town Council of the Burgh of Falkland;
- (9) The Town Council of the Burgh of Ladybank;
- (10) The Town Council of the Burgh of Newburgh;
- (11) The Town Council of the Burgh of Cowdenbeath;
- (12) The Town Council of the Burgh of Culross;
- (13) The Town Council of the Burgh of Dunfermline;

And whereas by the principal Order it is further provided that subject to the provisions therein contained all things that may be necessary for the purposes of carrying out the said Regulations within the districts of the Combining Authorities shall be undertaken by a Joint Committee, to be called the Fife and Kinross Venereal Diseases Joint Committee, and that the principal Order may be amended by the Scottish Board of Health after consultation with the said Joint Committee from time to time as they may deem necessary;

And whereas after consultation with the said Joint Committee, the Scottish Board of Health have resolved to make the amending Order underwritten:

Therefore the Scottish Board of Health, in exercise of the powers competent to them under Section 83 of the said Act of 1897, and

under the principal Order and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as The Venereal Diseases Fife and Kinross Combination Amendment Order, 1927, and shall be read as one with the principal Order, and the principal Order and this Order may be cited together as the Venereal Diseases Fife and Kinross Combination Orders, 1920 and 1927.

2. Article 3 of the principal Order (which relates to Finance, Basis of Contributions and Requisition for Funds) shall have effect subject to the following amendments:—

(1) As from and after the sixteenth day of May 1928, the reference in paragraph (1) to the valuation of the respective districts of the Combining Authorities according to the latest Valuation Rolls shall be construed as a reference to the rateable valuation (within the meaning of the Rating (Scotland) Act, 1926) of the respective districts of the Combining Authorities according to the latest Valuation Roll.

(2) As from the sixteenth day of May 1927, paragraph (2) shall have effect as if 15th June were therein substituted for 31st July.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

Commencing at the point on the River Spey where it is crossed by the road from Grantown Station to Grantown, thence in a north easterly direction along the River Spey to Cromdale Bridge, thence in a north westerly direction along the old road *via* West Part, Garrow Mill, and Heathfield, thence in a north westerly direction to the L. M. & S. Rly. bridge at Lynmacgregor, thence in a southerly direction to its junction with the old road from Glenbeg to Inveradon, thence along the latter road to the River Spey, thence in a westerly direction along that river to its junction with the River Dulan; thence in a generally westerly direction along the last mentioned river to the point where it is crossed by the Highland Railway from Inverness to Aviemore; thence along that railway in a generally north western direction to the point where it crosses the River Findhorn; thence in a northerly and north easterly direction along that river to its junction with the River Divie near Relugas House; thence in an easterly and then southerly direction along the last named river to the point where it meets the road from Stripeside to Dallas; thence in a north easterly direction along that road *via* Johnstripe, Lochna Graan, Redcraig, Auchness and Craigroy to the point where it is joined by the road leading to Priestfield and Kirdellbeg; thence in a southerly direction along the latter road to its junction with the road leading to Blacksboat Station; thence easterly along the last mentioned road to the county boundary; thence in a southerly, westerly and southerly direction along the county boundary to the point where it meets the road leading from Advie to Bridge of Avon; thence easterly along that road to its junction with the River Avon; thence in a southerly direction along the River Avon *via* Drumin, Balnellan, and Strathavon Lodge to the Bridge of Avon north west of Tomintoul; thence along the road leading from Bridge of Avon to Bridge of Brown; thence in a westerly and then northerly direction along General Wade's Military Road *via* Lynemore, Ballenluig and Topperfettle and the road leading to Grantown Station to the point of commencement.
