REDUCTION OF EXCEPTIONAL RATES.

OTICE is hereby given that the Railway Rates Tribunal have prescribed that the Notice dated the 18th January 1928, with reference to Classification of Merchandise, be extended so as to include applications as to the Reductions to be made from the Standard Charges where Damageable Merchandise is carried under Owner's Risk Conditions.
