PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 14 (1) of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913, penalties are imposed upon any person injuring or defacing (among other things) any monument to which that Section applies by virtue of an Order in Council made thereunder and by sub-section (4) of the

same section it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that the said section shall apply to any monument specified in the Order which appears to His Majesty to be an ancient monument within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the above mentioned Act, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and prescribe that Section 14 of the said Act shall apply to the following monuments which appear to His Majesty to be ancient monuments within the meaning of the said Act.
