THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (TOWN COUNCIL OF UNITED BURGH OF BLAIRGOWRIE AND RATRAY) ORDER (SCOTLAND), 1929, DATED 23RD AUGUST 1929, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 10 (5) OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1929 (19 & 20 GEO. 5, CH. 25).

In pursuance of the powers vested in him by Section 10 (5) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929, the Secretary of State hereby makes the following Order:—

(1) The number of councillors to be elected for the United Burgh of Blairgowrie and Ratray shall be nine;

(2) The number of magistrates to be elected for the said United Burgh shall be three.

(3) This Order may be cited as the Local Government (Town Council of United Burgh of Blairgowrie and Ratray) Order (Scotland), 1929.
