The KING has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the 18th September 1929, to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Seal appointed by the Treaty of Union to be kept and made use of in place of the Great Seal of Scotland appointing His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., P.C., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., to be His Majesty's High Commissioner to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, which is to meet on the 2nd October 1929, consequent upon the Union of the Church of Scotland with the United Free Church of Scotland.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 15TH SEPTEMBER 1929.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Holding of Special Markets of fat stock at Glasgow Market.

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 5 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") a special market or sale of animals intended for immediate slaughter may be held in that portion of Glasgow City Corporation Market described in the Schedule hereto, on each Wednesday, subject to the following conditions:—

(a) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed at every such market or sale;

(b) All the animals exposed at such market or sale on any Wednesday shall be slaughtered in the Glasgow City Abattoir adjoining the market before midnight on Friday of the same week;

(c) No persons, except persons actually engaged in tending the animals, shall enter
