This Order shall come into force on the first day of October 1929, and the Order of the Secretary for Scotland dated the 27th August 1889, determining the number of County Councillors for each County Council in Scotland and apportioning them between the county and each of the burghs entitled to be represented on the County Council, so far as relating to the County of Caithness, and the Order of the Boundary Commissioners under the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, dated the 3rd July 1891, relating to the County of Caithness, together with any Orders amending the same, are hereby repealed as from 16th May 1930.

THE RATING AND VALUATION (APPORTIONMENT) ACT APPEAL REGULATIONS (SCOTLAND), 1929, DATED SEPTEMBER 25TH, 1929, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER THE RATING AND VALUATION (APPORTIONMENT) ACT, 1928 (18 & 19 GEO. 5, c. 44).

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 9 (15) (b) of the Rating and Valuation (Apportionment) Act, 1928, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Rating and Valuation (Apportionment) Act Appeal Regulations (Scotland), 1929.

2. Section 8 of the Lands Valuation (Scotland) Act, 1854, and Section 7 of the Valuation of Lands (Scotland) Amendment Act, 1867, shall in their application to any valuation roll for the year beginning 16th May 1929, have effect as if for the reference therein to the 30th day of September there were substituted references to the 15th day of October.
