LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1929.

RECONSTITUTED COUNTY COUNCIL FOR THE COUNTY OF MIDLOTHIAN.

ORDER by the Secretary of State determining the contents and boundaries of the electoral divisions of the County of Midlothian, the number of county councillors for the County and the apportionment of these county councillors between the landward area and the burghs entitled to be represented on the County Council.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 8 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929, I hereby determine as follows:—

lothian (in this Order called the County) the number of county councillors for the County shall be 55.

2. The number of county councillors to be elected for the landward area of the County

shall be 34.

3. The contents and boundaries of the electoral divisions of the County shall be as follows:-

No. of Division.	Name of Division.	Contents and Boundaries.
1	Addiewell	That part of the parish of West Calder which lies to the west of a line drawn from the point at which the parish boundary is intersected by the footbridge across the Breich Water north of Burnhouse direct to the point at which the Cleland and Mid Calder Railway line crosses the Longhil Burn, thence up the last mentioned Burn to its source and thence in a south-westerly direction straight to the boundary of the parish.
2	Harburn	That part of the parish of West Calder which lies to the east of a line drawn up the Killandean Burn from the point at which it enters the parish boundary to the point at which it is joined by Harwood Water and thence up the said Harwood Water to the parish boundary.
3	West Calder (South).	That part of the parish of West Calder which is bounded on the west by the Addiewell division, on the east by the Harburn division and on the north-west by the centre of the Ayr Road.
4 5	West Calder (North). Mid Calder (North).	The remainder of the parish of West Calder. 'That part of the parish of Mid Calder which lies to the north of the medium filum of the river Almond.
6 7	Mid Calder (South). Kirknewton North.	The remainder of the parish of Mid Calder. That part of the parish of Kirknewton which lies to the north of a line drawn in a generally easterly direction along the centre of the road from Mid Calder to Kirknewton from the point at which the said road leaves the parish of Mid Calder to the point at which it is crossed by the London Midland and Scottish Railway line and thence along the centre of the said railway line to the eastern boundary of the parish.
9 9	Kirknewton South. Ratho and Kirkliston (North).	The remainder of the parish of Kirknewton. (1) That part of the parish of Ratho which lies to the north of the centre of the Union Canal, and (2) that part of the parish of Kirkliston so far as situated in the County of Midlothian which lies to the north of the centre of the Union Canal.
10	Ratho and Kirkliston (South).	(1) The remainder of the parish of Ratho, and (2) the remainder of the parish of Kirkliston so far as situated in the County of Midlothian.
11	Currie (North)	That part of the parish of Currie which lies to the north of the medium filum of the Water of Leith.
12 13	Currie (South) Penicuik (East)	The remainder of the water of Lenth. The remainder of the parish of Currie. That part of the parish of Penicuik which is included within the following boundary, viz.:—A line drawn up the medium filum of the river North Esk from a point on the parish boundary at Wester Auchendinny bridge to the point at which it meets the boundary of the Kirkhill, Eskbridge and Harper's Brae Special Water Supply District at the bridge crossing the said river on the Kirkhill Road, thence
