TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 11th October 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 14th October 1929, to Saturday the 19th October 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the

House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

DRIFT NETS MENDING TRADE BOARD
(GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES
FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April 1927, the Drift Nets Mending Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers.

Particulars of the proposed variation may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary, which may be lodged with them within two months from the 8th October 1929. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Drift Nets Mending Trade Board (Great Britain), 1 Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1. It is desirable that Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons what is objected to.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal upon Andries Muller Heyns, of the district of George, Cape Province, South Africa.

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:—

On the 28th December 1927, at Little Brak Beach, Mossel Bay, South Africa, a youth named Ockardus Johannes Heyns, aged 17, was bathing with a party of friends when suddenly he was attacked by a man-eating shark, which carried him some distance out to sea and bit off his left leg above the knee.

With the full realisation of the danger he was incurring one of the bathers, Andries Muller Heyns, an uncle of Ockardus Heyns, immediately went out to the assistance of his nephew. The shark, meanwhile, had returned

to the attack, and had gripped Ockardus Heyns by the right foot and ankle. Andries Heyns got hold of his nephew and tried to free him from the shark; nevertheless the foot and ankle of Ockardus Heyns were severely crushed.

Andries Heyns succeeded in reaching the shore with his nephew, who soon became unconscious, and died some hours later in Mossel Bay Hospital.
