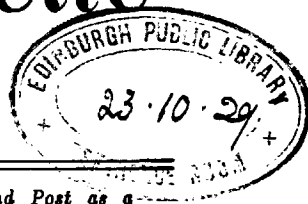

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1929.

RECONSTITUTED COUNTY COUNCIL

FOR THE

COUNTY OF STIRLING.

ORDER by the Secretary of State determining the contents and boundaries of the electoral divisions of the County of Stirling, the number of county councillors for the County and the apportionment of these county councillors between the landward area and the burghs entitled to be represented on the County Council.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 8 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929, I hereby determine as follows:—

1. For the purposes of the reconstitution of the County Council of the County of Stirling (in this Order called the County) the number of county councillors for the County shall be 71.
2. The number of county councillors to be elected for the landward area of the County shall be 40.
3. The contents and boundaries of the electoral divisions of the County shall be as follows:—

No. of Division.	Name of Division.	Contents and Boundaries.
1	Buchanan	The parish of Buchanan.
2	Drymen	The parish of Drymen.
3	Balfron	The parish of Balfron.
4	Fintry and Killearn	(1) The parish of Fintry, and (2) the parish of Killearn.
5	Strathblane	The parish of Strathblane.
6	Baldernock	The parish of Baldernock.
7	Lennoxton	That part of the parish of Campsie which is included within the following boundary, viz., a line starting at the level crossing on the London and North Eastern Railway line at Rowantreefauld, and running thence first in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the said railway line to the point at which it crosses the Lennox mill-lade, and
