and the other crews to rig hoses. On reaching  
the turret he assisted men who were coming  
out of it with their clothes on fire, and took  
charge of the work of extinguishing the flames,  
getting them into stretchers, &c. He followed  
the gunnery officer into the turret when the  
latter first went in and remained in the gun  
house until all necessary work was completed.  
He displayed marked initiative, coolness and  
pluck for an officer of his age.

Able Seaman G. P. Niven entered the turret  
shortly after Midshipman Cobham and helped  
to evacuate wounded. He followed the

gunnery officer down to the pump room, saying  
"I'm not going to let him go down alone."  
After this Officer had returned to the gun house  
Able Seaman Niven heard someone call from  
below and went right down to the shell hand-  
ing room to see what was wanted.

Decree modifying the Regulating Law of the Adjusting Commission of the Public Internal Debt.

In the margin, a seal which states: Federal Executive Power, United Mexican States, Ministry of the Interior.

The Provisional President of the United Mexican States has addressed to me the following Decree:

" Emilio Portes Gil, Provisional President of the United Mexican States, to their inhabitants, know:

That in virtue of the power granted to me by the Law of January 25th, 1929, I have issued the following

**DECREE.**

ARTICLE 1.—The time limits set forth in the Regulating Law of February 20th, 1929, in order to validate credits to which that Law refers are extended from to-day until February 28th, 1930, inclusive.

ARTICLE 2.—An addition is made to Article 2, Section XI. of the Regulating Law of February 20th, 1929, in the following form:

" Nevertheless, the claims of foreigners  
 " which were before the National Commis-

"sions now abolished and which had not been presented to the Mixed International Commissions within the periods provided by the Conventions, may be considered and resolved by the Adjusting Commission of the Public Internal Debt under the same conditions as allowed to Mexicans, for indemnifications, and in accordance with the present Regulating Law, provided that the persons interested continue their action in the form laid down in Article 8 of the same, within the extended period to which the preceding article refers."

I therefore order that this shall be printed, published, circulated and put into effect as required.

Given in the Palace of the Federal Executive Power, in Mexico, on the 21st of November 1929. (Signed) E. PORTES GIL. Secretary of State and of the Treasury—(signed) L. MONTES DE OCA. To the Under-Secretary of the Interior in charge of the office, City."
