The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of February 1930 (N. 365/30), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, wages, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been a Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas by His late Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of October 1905, we are authorised to grant to Boy Artificers selected to act as Chief Petty Officer Boys or Petty Officer Boys weekly allowances at the following rates, viz. :—

Chief Petty Officer Boys 4d. a week.
Petty Officer Boys ... 3d. a week.

“And whereas in the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service,

and in Order in Council bearing date the 3rd day of November 1927, such Boy Artificers are now designated Artificer Apprentices :

“And whereas we consider it desirable to increase the allowances payable to Artificer Apprentices selected to act as Chief Petty Officer Apprentices and Petty Officer Apprentices in Your Majesty's Mechanical Training Establishment at Chatham :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to increase the weekly allowances payable to Chief Petty Officer Apprentices and Petty Officer Apprentices in Your Majesty's Mechanical Training Establishment at Chatham to the following rates, viz. :—

Chief Petty Officer Apprentices 1s. a week.
Petty Officer Apprentices ... 6d. a week.

“The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928 (7 E. 7. c. 29; 4-5 G. 5. c. 18; 9-10 G. 5. c. 80, and 18 G. 5. c. 3), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty Series No. 16 (1928)) comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Mexico has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Mexico the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Mexico or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 28th May 1889 (S.R. & O. Rev. 1904, IX., Patents, &c. p. 9), Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (46-7 V. c. 57), as amended by the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (Amendment) Act, 1885 (48-9 V. c. 63), should apply to Mexico, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His

Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Mexico confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Mexico or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to Mexico.

3. The Order in Council dated the 28th May 1889 is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Mexico) Order, 1930.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1927, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1929, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1929, amending the first-mentioned Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the first-mentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order that this Order should come into operation forthwith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following proviso shall be inserted at the end of paragraph 1 of Schedule VI. to the principal Order:—

" Provided that, where the aircraft has been previously registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Secretary of State is satisfied—

(a) that the certificate of registration last issued in respect of the aircraft lapsed by reason of the sale of the aircraft by the registered owner; and

(b) that the registered owner of the aircraft immediately before the sale was the constructor thereof or a dealer in aircraft; and

(c) that the aircraft has not been flown since a certificate of registration was last

issued in respect thereof, except for the purpose of—

- (i.) an experiment or test carried out in the ordinary course of construction or in order to obtain a certificate of airworthiness; or
- (ii.) a demonstration to a prospective purchaser; or
- (iii.) delivering the aircraft to a purchaser;

the fee chargeable for the issue of the certificate shall be five shillings.”

2. The following paragraphs shall be substituted for paragraph 6 of Schedule VI. to the principal Order:—

“ 6. Subject to the provisions of this paragraph and paragraph 6B of this Schedule, the fees chargeable in respect of the grant of licences for personnel shall be in accordance with the following table—

Provided that—

- (a) where an applicant for a licence of any description has previously been medically examined for a licence of any other description for which a similar standard of medical fitness is prescribed, the fee chargeable for official medical examination (if required) shall be 10s. 6d.;
- (b) where an applicant for a pilot's licence in respect of flying machines under paragraph 4 of Schedule V. to this Order

is qualified as a Royal Air Force Pilot and is granted exemption from flying test under paragraph 5 of that Schedule conditionally upon the satisfactory completion of a special flying test, the fee chargeable for official flying test shall be £1 1s. 0d.

6A. Subject to the provisions of the next following paragraph, the fees chargeable in respect of the renewal of licences for personnel shall be in accordance with the following table—

6B. Where an applicant for the grant or renewal of any licence referred to in paragraph 6 of this Schedule is not required to pass any particular part of the appropriate technical examination or official flying test by reason of his having passed that part on some previous application or for any other reason, the fee chargeable for the technical examination or official flying test, as the case may be, may be reduced by such amount as the Secretary of State may think proper in the circumstances of the case.

6C. The fee chargeable in respect of the issue or renewal of a licence for a competent person under paragraph 11 of Schedule II.

to this Order shall be 5s. for technical examination and 5s. for the licence.

6D. The fee chargeable for the issue of a master pilot's certificate shall be 10s.”

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1930.

(2) The Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1929, is hereby revoked.

(3) This Order shall come into operation provisionally as from the date hereof in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

SCHEME of District Councils under Section 25 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1929.

Made by the County Council on 9th January and 25th February 1930, and approved by the Secretary of State for Scotland on 3rd March 1930.

The Landward Area of the County shall be divided into five Districts for the purpose of establishing District Councils, as follows:—

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

REFERENCE TO STANDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an amended application received by them for the making of an Order in Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

- (a) Drawing boards, sketching boards, easels, T-squares, set-squares, curves, palettes and pantographs;
- (b) Chalks, crayons and pastels whether moulded, pressed or cut; Drawing inks;
- (c) (i.) Colours of the types used by artists, art students, architects, draughtsmen and the decorative arts;
- (ii.) Colour boxes, whether filled or un-filled;
- (d) The following articles of the types used by artists and art students:—
 - (i.) Brushes for oil, water colours and Tempera painting;
 - (ii.) Canvas and canvas substitutes whether mounted on panels or not and frames and stretchers therefor;
 - (iii.) Prepared wood panels.

The reference previously made to the Standing Committee in respect of these classes and descriptions of goods is annulled.

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the above Act the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.
