ROBERT HERVEY, merchant in Glasgow, having been appointed Trustee on the sequestrated estates of the said John & Niel Macpherson, as a company, and John Macpherson and Niel Macpherson, individual partners of that concern, and his appointment confirmed by the Court of Session, hereby intimates, that, upon his application, the Sheriff of Lanarkshire has fixed Friday the 7th, and Friday the 21st August next, at 1 o'clock afternoon, in the Sheriff-court house, Glasgow, for the public examination of the bankrupts, and others acquainted with their affairs; and a meeting of the Creditors will be held within the offices of M'Pherson & M'Lachlan, writers in Glasgow, on Saturday, the 22d August 1807, at 2 o'clock afternoon, in order to elect Commissioners, and give instructions to the Trustee as to the management and recovery of the sequestrated estates. The Creditors are also required to produce, in the hands of the Trustee, their claims and vouchers of debt, with oaths to the verity thereof, at or previous to said meeting; with certification, that unless these productions are made on or before the 26th day of March next, being ten months after the date of the sequestration, the Creditors neglecting will have no share in the first dividend of the funds.
