REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

With reference to the Notice which was published in the issue of the London, Edinburgh, and Belfast Gazettes of the 18th July 1930, regarding the report of the Standing Committee appointed by the Board of Trade respecting Artists' and Drawing Materials, the Board of Trade hereby give notice that they are in receipt of a letter from the Standing Committee, dated the 17th November, which states that in that report the Com-

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF FEMALE SORTING CLERK AND TELEGRAPHIST IN BELFAST, EDINBURGH AND CERTAIN PROVINCIAL TOWNS IN GREAT BRITAIN IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE POSTMASTER-GENERAL.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 15 and 18. Candidates must be within the prescribed limits of age on the day of the examination.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.
