DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1925.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY.

(DAVID FRENCH RITCHIE.)

Whereas David French Ritchie, Pharmaceutical Chemist, of 2 Wilton Avenue, Southampton, being a person duly registered under the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said David French Ritchie cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, nor to carry on the business of manufacturing, selling or distributing any of the drugs to which Part III. of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now therefore, after consultation with the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, and in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by No. 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by No. 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said David French Ritchie, the authority granted by the said Regulations to persons who lawfully keep open shop for the retailing of poisons to be in possession of and

to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, or to manufacture any extract or tincture of Indian hemp or any preparation, or to carry on the business of retailing, dispensing or compounding the drugs or preparations to which Part III. of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given, under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, with the consent of the Treasury and the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 19 of the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, to make Regulations to be entitled the National Health Insurance (Isle of Man Reciprocal Arrangements) Regulations, 1931.
