REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

FLUSH PIPES OF IRON OR STEEL.

With reference to the notice which was published in the London Gazette of the 21st July, and the Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes of the 24th July, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of imported iron or steel flush pipes (whether galvanised or not), the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-Section 7, that a Report has been made by the Committee in respect of the aforesaid description of goods.

Mr. Isaac Foot, M.P., Secretary for Mines, has appointed Mr. Ernest Laundon to be a Sub-Inspector of Quarries under the Quarries Act, 1894.

Under the provisions of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, and of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, Mr. Isaac Foot has further appointed Mr. Laundon to be an Inspector of Factories and Workshops for the purposes of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, in so far as that Act is applicable to quarries as defined in Part II. of the Sixth Schedule to the Act.
