The King has been pleased, by Royal Warrant bearing date the 24th December 1931, to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Seal appointed to be kept and made use of in place of the Great Seal of Scotland, granting the rank and dignity of Counsel to His Majesty to John Macgregor, Esquire, Advocate, a Member of the Scottish Bar.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment

of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in preparing, spinning, twisting and balling manilla hemp in the Trawl Twine and Sisal Cord Departments at the works of The Gourcock Ropework Company Limited, Port Glasgow, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours and messroom accommodation shall be provided.
