DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920–1925. WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY.

(WILLIAM MARWOOD WATON.)

Whereas William Marwood Waton, of 17 New Yard, Nottingham, being a person duly registered under the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said William Marwood Waton cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, nor to carry on the business of manufacturing, selling or distributing any of the drugs to which Part III. of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, after consultation with the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, and in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by No. 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928,
