PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Department of Health for Scotland have, in pursuance of the powers competent to them under the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation that they have received a copy of an Interlocutor pronounced by the Sheriff-Substitute of Aberdeen, Kincardine and Banff, dated 4th December 1929, finding that the Old Churchyard of Fordoun adjoining the Parish Church of Fordoun in the Parish of Fordoun and County of Kincardine is so situated and so crowded as to be offensive and dangerous to health and contrary to decency:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that Burials be forthwith discontinued in the said Burial Ground in terms of Section 5 of the aforesaid Act except for the burial therein of relicts having spouses interred in said Burial Ground prior to the date of the Order in Council closing the same; Provided always as regards future interments that the exercise of the right of burial be not injurious to public health or offensive or contrary to decency; that notice be given to the District Sanitary Inspector not later than the day preceding that on which a grave is to be opened and that no interment shall be made unless the coffin can be laid at a depth of four feet from the surface of the ground to the upper side of

the coffin and that without interference with the remains of a previous interment:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased to give notice of such Representation and to Order that the same be taken into consideration on the 27th day of April next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order, or Notice thereof, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and that copies of this Order or Notice thereof, be fixed as required by the aforesaid Act on the doors of the Church of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parish or parishes affected one month before such Representation is considered.
