Pursuant to Section 21 of the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1928, notice is hereby given that the Commissioners under the said Act have submitted to the Scottish Education Department a Scheme entitled

HANNAHFIELD TRUST SCHEME, 1932,

for the future government and management of the Endowment in the Counties of Dumfries and Wigtown and the Stewartry of Kirkcudbright known as the Hannahfield Trust, hitherto held and administered under a Warrant of Gift given by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria at Her Court at Windsor Castle and under Her Privy Seal of Scotland at Edinburgh on 11th July 1879, in the forty-third

year of Her Reign, and Written to the Seal and Registered on 24th July 1879.

The Scottish Education Department will, during two months from the date hereof, receive any objections made to them in writing by any public body or persons interested respecting such Scheme.
