MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

REPORTS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

With reference to the Notices which were published in certain issues of the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes regarding references made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, namely:—

- (1) in the issue of the London Gazette of the 16th August 1932, and of the Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes of the 19th August 1932, in respect of imported wood wool and wood wool rope;
- (2) in the issue of the said Gazettes of the 26th August 1932, in respect of imported measuring tapes made of cotton or linen:

the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Subsection 7, that Reports have been made by the Committee in respect of the aforesaid classes and descriptions of goods.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that, in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order in Council to require imported wireless valves and rectifying valves to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect thereof.

Attention is called to the fact that, while, under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also, at their discretion, consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.
