FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1901 to 1929.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the manufacture, use, and storage of cellulose solutions to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make Regulations, under Section 79 of the Act, to apply to all factories and workshops in which cellulose solutions, as defined in the Regulations, are manufactured, used, or stored.

Copies of the Regulations proposed to be made may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W.1.

Any objection to the draft Regulations must be sent to the Secretary of State, at the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, within 40 days of the date of this Notice. The objection must be in writing and must state:—
