

TO THE CREDITORS OF  
ANDREW WILSON & CO. late Merchants in Glasgow, and Andrew Wilson, as an Individual.

ANDREW WILSON, the bankrupt, soon after his public examination took place, and a general meeting of the Creditors was held, made an offer to the Creditors, on 20th September 1806, to pay them 1s. sterling per pound upon the amount of the debts owing to them, for which he agreed to grant them his acceptances, payable at eighteen months and two years from and after said 20th September 1806, by equal instalments, and that over and beside the dividend which would arise to them out of the property conveyed by him to Mr Handyside, the Trustee. This offer or proposition was acceded to by the whole Creditors, it being understood, that the expence attending the sequestration should be paid out of the funds arising from the said estates. And, in consequence of the Creditors having accepted of the said proposal, Andrew Wilson granted to them bills for the said 1s. sterling in the pound of the debts due to them, which they accepted of accordingly.

That a report of the proceedings having been since made up by the Trustee, and a bond of cautionry for the composition lodged with the clerk, along with a list of debts proven against the estate, and list of Creditors who agreed to accept the composition, and other writings, from which it appeared, that the whole Creditors who had produced their grounds of debt, with oaths of verity thereon, under the sequestration, had acceded to the offer, an application was made to the Lords of Council and Session, to approve of the composition offered, and to discharge the said Andrew Wilson & Co. and Andrew Wilson, as an individual, of all debts contracted prior to 14th May 1806, the date of the first deliverance on the petition of sequestration, except as to the payment of the composition, and also for an exoneration of the Trustee, &c. On this petition the Lords gave the following deliverance.—  
“Edinburgh, November 18, 1807. The Lords having heard this petition, they appoint the same to be intimated upon the walls of the Inner and Outer-Houses in common form, and in the Minute-Book, and also to be advertised in the Edinburgh Gazette, that all parties having interest may object thereto, if they think fit; and upon such intimation and advertisement being duly made and published, the Lords declare they will, in terms of the Statute, resume the consideration of this petition, and proceed to determine therein, with or without objections.”  
Agreeably to this deliverance, the present intimation is accordingly made by the Trustee.
