SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II. of the Sheep Scab-Order of 1928:—

Inverness.—An Area comprising:

The islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, and Boreray), in the county of Inverness.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising:—

The Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AND DOUBLE DIPPING AREA

The following Area is a "Movement rea" and a "Double Dipping Area" for the purposes of Parts II. and III. of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—
