A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

Whereas our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the 17th day of December next, we, with the advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be farther prorogued on the said 17th day of December next to Thursday the 21st day of January next; and we have given order to our Chancellor of that part of our united kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and we do farther hereby, with the advice aforesaid, declare our will and pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said 21st day of January next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said 21st day of January next.

Given at our Court at the Queen's Palace, the 25th day of November 1807, in the 48th year of our reign.

IN consequence of the loss of the vessel called the Garland, in which the said William M'Kay sailed for Buenos Ayres, and upon whose safe arrival there, insurance to a considerable extent was effected before his departure from this country, funds are likely to be recovered, nearly equal to the amount of the debts claimed on the sequestrated estate. And at a meeting of the Commissioners, held upon the 4th day of November last, the Trustee having reported to them the state of the claim upon the underwriters, and the likelihood of the recovery of a fund nearly equal to William M'Kay's debts, the Commissioners were of opinion, that in the particular circumstances in which that fund had arisen, a certain proportion of it should be set aside, to be employed in the purchase of an annuity to Mr M'Kay's widow; and this they recommended in the strongest manner to the Creditors. And in order that this measure might be fully deliberated upon and discussed, they enjoined the Trustee to call a general meeting of the Creditors in the last week of December, for the purpose of receiving their advice and instruction, whether any, and what, proportion of the sums so to be recovered from the underwriters should be set aside, in order to be invested in an annuity for Mrs M'Kay.
