SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II. of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

Inverness.—An Area comprising:—

The Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, and Boreray; and except the parish of North Uist and all the islands therein, together with the Island of Berneray, in the parish of Harris, and all the grazing islands attached thereto), in the county of Inverness.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising:—

The Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

Stirlingshire, Dunbartonshire and Perthshire.—An Area comprising:—

In the county of Stirling.

The parish of Buchanan.

That part of the parish of Drymen that lies to the west of the public road which passes Balfunning House and which runs from the bridge over the Kelty Water at Wester Third to Drymen bridge over the River Endrick.

In the county of Dunbarton.

The premises known respectively as Ardleish Farm and Doune Farm in the parish of Arrochar.

In the county of Perth.

That part of the parish of Aberfoyle (including the premises in the occupation of the Glasgow Corporation known as Stronachlachar Farm and the premises known as Frenich Farm) which lies to the south and west of a line drawn from the point where the eastern boundary of Stronachlachar Farm joins Loch Katrine along the eastern boundary of the said Stronachlachar Farm; thence along the eastern boundary of Frenich Farm; thence along the western shore of Loch Chon; thence along the River Chon; thence along the southern shore of Loch Ard; thence along the River Forth to the point where it crosses the parish boundary near Gartmore Station.

That part of the parish of Port of Menteith that lies to the west of the road that runs from Gartmore Station to the bridge over the Kelty Water at Wester Third.

The movement of sheep out of the following area is regulated by the North Uist (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934:—

An area in the county of Inverness comprising the parish of North Uist and all the islands therein, together with the Island of Berneray, in the parish of Harris, and all the grazing islands attached thereto.
