TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 28th December 1934, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 31st December 1934 to Saturday the 5th January 1935 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not

less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London

Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief

Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

Civil Service Commission, December 21, 1934.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for situations in the General Post Office as Male Assistant Superintendent of Traffic (Class II.) in the London Telephone Service, and Male Assistant Traffic Superintendent in the Provinces will be held, commencing on the 30th April 1935, under the Regulations dated the 28th August 1928, and published in the London Gazette of the same date and in the Edinburgh Gazette of 31st August 1928.

The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the first part of the Examination may be held:—Belfast, Birmingham, Bristol, Glasgow, Leeds, London, and Manchester.

The final list of centres will be decided when the number of candidates desiring examination at each centre is known.

Not fewer than six candidates will be appointed on the result of this Examination, if so many should be found to be duly qualified.

No person will be admitted to examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received on or before the 7th March 1935, an application, in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

Section 19 (as amended).

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport has received an application from the Birmingham and District Dairymens' Association Ltd., being an organisation representative of employers in a section of the road transport industry concerned with the conveyance of goods by road, which the Minister of Labour has certified to be a proper body to make such an application, for a variation of the periods of time laid down in Section 19 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended by Section 31 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933, for the employment of drivers of road vehicles of certain types.

As provided in Sub-section (3) of Section 19 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the Minister has referred the matter to the Industrial Court for advice. The Court has fixed Thursday, 10th January 1935, at 10.30 a.m., at No. 5 Old Palace Yard, Westminster, S.W.1, as the time and place for hearing parties to the application.

Copies of the proposals contained in the application for the variation of the periods of time laid down in Section 19 of the Act can be obtained from the Secretary of the Industrial Court at the address given above, and any person representing organisations of employers or workpeople in the industry who may desire to make representations to the Court in the matter, should submit such representations to the Secretary of the Industrial Court in writing.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACTS, 1924 to 1932.
