

COUNTY OF FIFE.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1929.

AMENDING DISTRICT COUNCIL SCHEME MADE BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY OF FIFE IN TERMS OF SECTION 25 AS READ WITH SECTION 14 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1929.

(1) The District Council Scheme made by the County Council of the County of Fife on the 11th October 1932 and approved by the Secretary of State as amended on the 27th October 1932 (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Scheme") shall be varied as follows:—
