ORDERS FOR MOURNING.

His Majesty The KING commands that officers of the Army shall wear mourning with their uniforms on the present melancholy occasion of the death of His late Majesty King George V. until the 20th July 1936:—

Officers are to wear crape on the left arm of the uniform and of the greatcoats.

The drums are to be covered with black, and black crape is to be hung from the top of the Colour Staff of Infantry, and from the Standard Staff and trumpets of Cavalry, until after the Funeral of His late Majesty.

Orders for the mourning to be worn by Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines for his late Most Gracious Majesty King George V. of blessed memory:—

The Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have received the commands of H.M. The King to direct, on the present melancholy occasion of the death of His Most Gracious Majesty King George V., that the Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines be re-

quired to wear a band of black crape round the left arm, when in uniform, as prescribed by the Regulations, and also when wearing the greatcoat.

The mourning will be for six months from the date of this Order, ending 20th July 1936.

Orders for the mourning to be worn by officers and warrant officers of the Royal Air Force for His late Most Gracious Majesty King George V. of blessed memory:—

The Air Council have received the Commands of His Majesty the King to direct, on the present melancholy occasion of the death of His Most Gracious Majesty King George V., that the officers and warrant officers of the Royal Air Force be required to wear a band of black crape round the left arm, when in uniform, as prescribed by the Regulations, and also when wearing the greatcoat.

The mourning will be for six months from the date of this Order, ending 20th July 1936.
