## CORONATION OF HIS MAJESTY.

### COURT OF CLAIMS.

THE Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty to hear and determine all Claims of Services to be performed at the time of His Majesty's Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 28th day of May last) and of fees to be received for the same, at their last meeting held at the Council Office, Whitehall, on the 30th day of July 1936, resolved as follows:—

(a) All claims must be made by petition. Petitions may be sent under cover to the Clerks to the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Downing Street, London, S.W.1.

(b) Petitioners are not required to appear in person before the Court unless summoned.

(c) Petitioners may appear by Counsel, solicitors, or agents.

(d) If a claim was admitted in 1910–11, the petitioner or his present representative should lodge a short formal petition stating that he is the same petitioner, or his repre-

sentative, and, if a representative, in what capacity, and that the petition was allowed in 1910–11.

(e) If there is no counterclaim, the Clerks shall forthwith place the claim in the list in order that it may be formally admitted upon the Court being satisfied that the claimant represents the person whose claim was admitted in 1910–11. In these cases, the petitioner need not appear in person or by Counsel, solicitor, or agent.

(f) The Clerks shall not place in the list any claim excluded by the Court in 1901–02 on the ground that the claim was inappropriate to the Coronation by reason of the Royal Proclamation.

(g) Any claim now made, which was referred by the Court in 1910–11 to the Executive Committee for the purposes of arrangements for the Coronation, shall be referred by the Clerks to the same Committee.

(h) Petitioners are to present their claims by the 31st day of October next.

(i) Petitions shall be in the form following:—

Each Petition shall be accompanied by twelve copies, which may be printed or reproduced by type, lithography, photostat, or stencil duplicating; and the type to be used shall be a type producing a clear and legible impression.

The Court stood adjourned till some day in the month of November next, of which notice will be given in the London, Edinburgh, and Belfast Gazettes, and the Press.

The Commissioners are required by the Proclamation to exclude from their consideration such claims as may be submitted to them in respect of rights or services connected with the parts of the ceremonial heretofore performed in Westminster Hall, and with the Procession, the Ceremony being confined to Westminster Abbey.

## MILK ACTS, 1934 AND 1936.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, have certified the cheese-milk price for the month of August 1936, as required by Sub-section 2 of Section 4 of the Milk Act, 1934, as amended by Section 5 and Part II. of the Schedule of the Milk (Extension of Temporary Provisions) Act, 1936, in the following terms:—

## CERTIFICATION OF CHEESE-MILK PRICE.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 4 of the Milk Act, 1934 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is provided that for the purposes of the Act the cheese-milk price for any month shall be the excess over one penny three farthings of the average of the prices per pound at which cheese such as is commonly known at the commencement of the Act as "New Zealand Finest White" and "Canadian Finest White" was sold wholesale in Great Britain during the immediately preceding month;

And whereas by Sub-section (2) of the said Section as amended by Section 5 and Part II. of the Schedule of the Milk (Extension of Temporary Provisions) Act, 1936, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, are required to certify as soon as may be after the beginning of September 1934, and of each subsequent month falling before October 1939, the cheese-milk price for that month;

Now therefore the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, hereby certify that the cheese-milk price for the month of August 1936 is 5.20 pence per pound.

The method by which the cheese-milk price for the month as certified above has been computed is as follows:—

(i.) The range of price quotations in respect of sales by wholesale of "New Zealand Finest White" cheese, and of "Canadian Finest White" cheese, as

published by the London Provision Exchange, Ltd., for each of the periods ended at 11.30 a.m. on each of the Fridays in the preceding month, has been examined.

(ii.) The average of the mean prices for the two kinds of cheese has been ascertained for each of the said periods, exceptional quotations being disregarded. The average of the periodic averages so ascertained has then been calculated to two places of decimals and expressed in pence per pound.

(iii.) From the figure thus obtained one penny three farthings has been subtracted and the balance gives the figure certified above.
