ROTHESAY TRAMWAYS COMPANY (TRAMWAYS LIMITED ABANDON-MENT) ORDER BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT.

HEREAS it is enacted in Section 6 of the Rothesay Tramways and Omnibuses Order, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1930"), inter alia, as follows:—

" (1) The Company may at any time after the commencement of this Order make application to the Minister for the abandonment of the tramways, and if on any such application the Minister is satisfied that it is just and expedient that an order should be made under the provisions of this section, having regard to all circumstances, the Minister may by order authorise the abandonment of the

And whereas it is enacted by Section 3 of the Order of 1930, inter alia, as follows:-

"The Company" means the Rothesay Tramways Company Limited;
"The Minister" means the Minister of

Transport;

''The tramways'' means the tramways constructed by the Company under the Tramways Rothesay Order 1880. Rothesay 1900, Tramways Order the Rothesay Tramways (Extension) 1902, the Rothesay Tramways (Amendment) Order 1918, and the Rothesay Tramways (Amendment) Order 1924, and includes the tramroad section;

'The tramroad section' means so much of the tramway No. 3 authorised by the Order of 1902 as is situate in lands on the south side of the public road leading from Port Bannatyne to Ettrick Bay, namely, the portion of that tramway between a point 1 furlong 0.95 chains or thereabouts from its commencement at Port Bannatyne and its termination at Ettrick Bay ";

And whereas the Rothesay Tramways Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company '') have made application to the Minister of Transport (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") under the said Section 6 of the Order of 1930 for an order authorising the abandonment by them of the said tramways;

And whereas pursuant to sub-section (2) of the said Section 6 of the Order of 1930 the Minister has required the Company to give such public and other notices of the said application as are therein prescribed;

And whereas no representations against the issue of the order have been made to the Minister;

And whereas the Minister is satisfied that it 15 just and expedient that an order should be made under the provisions of the said Section 6 of the Order of 1930

Now therefore the Minister, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 6 of the Order of 1930, and of any and every other power thereunto him enabling hereby orders as follows:-

- (1) The Minister authorises the abandonment of the said tramways and in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (1) of the said Section 6 prescribes that the 30th day of September 1936 shall be the date as from which the abandonment shall take effect.
- (2) This Order may be cited as the Rothesay Tramways Company Limited (Tramways Abandonment) Order 1936
